#### **Reading and Books at Home**

Having books in the home is proven to positively benefit children in so many ways. A recent two-decade long study found that simply having their own books at home increases children's academic success, vocabulary development, attention and job attainment.

There are many ways we encourage children to have books at home.

- Children are always welcome to borrow books from their class libraries alongside any "reading scheme" books they may also be asked to practice at home.
- We sell brand new books in school for only £2.00 each. The school bookshop is always open and children are welcome to come along and browse and buy a book whenever they want to.
- We give books as awards for being "Reading Stars" or for reading regularly at home. Don't forget to sign your child's reading diary as each time they achieve 50 reads at home they earn a free visit to the school bookshop.
- Next week we will be launching our new second hand "Book Swap Shop" which is in the school
  entrance hall. Children are welcome to take books home and keep them for as long as they wish
  to. We would welcome any donations of good quality used children' books to add to the Swap
  Shop.
- We strongly encourage all the children to join Gamesley Library which is next door to the school.
  There is no charge for borrowing books from the library and children can choose up to eight at a
  time. We've sent home joining forms with each child tonight and you can also pick up additional
  forms from the library.

Research also shows that reading to your children has many benefits: it provides comfort and reassurance, confidence and security, relaxation, happiness and fun. Giving a child time and full attention when reading them a story tells them they matter. It builds self-esteem, vocabulary, feeds imagination and even improves their sleeping patterns.

So, go and grab some books from the local bookshop, school or library and enjoy some time reading with your children!

### After School Clubs began on Monday 26th September

You can still book your child's place in afterschool clubs via Arbor. It is really important that you let us know if your children are unable to attend for any reason as otherwise staff can waste a lot of time looking for children who are not in school rather than leading their clubs.
