Nursery Inspection

As you may be aware, Ofsted inspected the nursery yesterday. We can't share the outcome with you until the report is published in September. However, I can tell you that the children behaved beautifully and the inspectors had lots of lovely things to say about them and about the very dedicated staff team.

INSET Days in September

As I am sure you are all aware now, we are very pleased to welcome the Nursery School onto school premises from September. As you can imagine, the move will need quite a lot of organisation so we have made the decision to move one of our INSET days from December to September. This means both schools will now open for the children on Thursday 7th September 2023.

The School Day

From September the main playground gates will open at 8.40am each morning for all children from Nursery to Year 6 and we expect everyone to be in their classrooms by 8.45am. Nursery families will bring their children to the gates at the right hand side of the Early Year's Unit and Reception parents to the gates at the left-hand side where they will be greeted by staff. We hope that by the end of September the Reception children will be walking into school on their own.

We strongly encourage children from Year 1 upwards to walk into school independently but do understand that with the classroom changes, some of the Year 1 children may need you support to get to their new classroom doors for the first week.

The morning nursery sessions finish at 11.45am and the children will leave school via the garden and steps area at the front of school. Afternoon nursery sessions begin at 12.15pm and those children should come into school via the front steps as well.

School Meals

Derbyshire County Council have advised us that the price of school meals will increase in September 2023 to £3.25 each day: £16.25 each week.

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to Free School Meals. Some children from Year 3 upwards may also be entitled to Free School Meals depending on your family circumstances, if you are not sure just contact the school office for more information. Our school dinners are prepared to a very high nutritional standard. If your child brings a packed lunch instead, please follow our healthy eating guidelines below:
