Individual and Family Photographs: Thursday 19th October

The arrangements for photograph day will be as follows:

1. 8.45am: Family groups including afternoon Nursery Children and baby brothers and sisters.

Please come to the front door *after* you have dropped your other children off at the school gate. You will be asked to sign in and wait in the hall. When it is your turn to have your children photographed, we will collect them from their classrooms for you. This is to avoid crowding in the hall and to ensure the children do not miss lesson time.

The photographer is only here for the morning, so if your child is in nursery in the afternoons only, you are welcome to come along at 8.45am to have their photograph taken on their own and/or with siblings.

2. Family groups of children in school.

If your child has not already had a group photograph taken and they have brothers and sisters in school, we will arrange for them to have their picture taken together.

3. Individual photographs.

We will also arrange for *all* children to have their individual photograph taken. As above, afternoon Nursery children should arrive at 8.45am if you wish their picture to be taken.

Proofs will be sent home with your children and there is no obligation to buy any pictures.

Open Evening: Wednesday 25th October 6.00pm to 7.00pm

This is an opportunity for families to meet staff, have a tour of the school and hear about the high-quality education on offer from both schools. The cost of the disco is £2.00 payable on the door and no extra money is needed as this includes something

to eat, drinks and face painting.

Our Orchard, Acorns, Conkers and Catkins children will be having their own spooky fun activities in class on Thursday instead of attending the disco.

We are hoping to decorate the hall and classrooms with some spooky carved pumpkins. There will be a prize for everyone who brings a carved pumpkin to school on Thursday 26th October and we will provide battery tealights so your pumpkins can be displayed in their full glory.
